COVID Safety

In addition to full compliance with strict NSW Public Health Orders, the Australian Turf Club (ATC) is taking a proactive approach to minimise the risk of exposure to COVID-19. ATC is committed to the health and well-being of all people visiting and working at all of our venues with CovidSafe plans including and not limited to:

- » All patrons tested on arrival with temperature scanning equipment
- » Hand sanitiser placed regularly at all venues

- e) Live in &/or visited identified Hotspot locations or Local Government Area.

ALL MEDIA intending to participate on this day, must be formally accredited by the Australian Turf Club, pre-register and provide their contact details. This is mandatory, imposed by governing health authorities, ensuring 'tracking and tracing' protocols are enabled in the event an outbreak is recognised.

ALL MEDIA will be temperature tested or thermal image scanned upon accessing their designated entry point

Physical distancing restrictions will be in place and policed by ATC Staff, ensuring 4m2 &/or 1.5m physical distancing are adhered to by people on course.

After Winx won it three times in a row, many of her vanquished were back last year to try to finally win it and Avilius strolled away to victory.



Timeform rating explanation

A Timeform rating is a long established principle of assigning a numeric figure to every racehorse after it runs in a race. The assessment for a specific race incorporates an aggregation of many statistical factors that make up the final number. It reflects a comparison to those others within that particular race and also as a relationship to other horses across the entire horse population. The higher the figure the better the performance. eg the greatest performance recorded in Timeform history is Frankel's Queen Anne win in 2012 when he rated 147.

After winning the Melbourne Cup on Brew at just 20, Kerrin McEvoy continues to win big races around the land. His historic back to back wins on Redzel in the first two runnings of The TAB Everest are already folklore. He's got another chance to win the grand prize on Classique Legend and has begun an association with the promising three-year-old Peltzer.

NASH RAWILLER

Nash Rawiller has returned home to Sydney and was immediately back in the top seeds of the riding ranks in 2020. Well entrenched in the top 3 of the Premiership, in Autumn he won the Canterbury Stakes on The Bostonian and George Ryder aboard Dreamforce. His strong, on-pace style is very much a punter's favourite.

TRAINERS TO WATCH

BJORN BAKER



Coming off a season where he more than doubled his Sydney metropolitan winners, Bjorn Baker will look to be winning more of the Group 1 races now from his Warwick Farm base. He landed a major in the Winx Stakes with Samadoubt last year and is likely to be getting his hands on even more quality stock.

JAMES CUMMINGS



Godolphin will always be a major player in Group 1 races and under the eye of James Cummings the stable continues to win big races around Australia. The Sydney Spring beckons for horses of all ages, from the younger Bivouac for the Godolphin slot in the TAB Everest and Collette in major weight for age and staying contests, to the ever-reliable Avilius.

MICHAEL, WAYNE ANTHONY & JOHN HAWKES | FREEDMAN



The Hall Of Famer John Hawkes, along with his sons Michael and Wayne look to have an incredible squad heading into the Sydney Spring with promising three-yearolds such as North Pacific and Doubtland alongside a growing list of older horses over varying distances including Masked Crusader and Master Of Wine.



Anthony Freedman doesn't train the big numbers of some of the other major stables but always has quality rather than quantity. He trained both the Caulfield Guineas and Victoria Derby winner last Spring so the 3YOs were firing. And now a new season one in Hanseatic will pose issues for his opponents this time in.

KRIS LEES



For a provincial based trainer, Kris Lees continues to make his mark in Sydney including at the major carnivals. He sits at the pointy end of the NSW Trainer's Premiership and has a raft of improving stayers with global backgrounds that will be fighting out many finishes around the country. He brought up his 2000th career winner last season.

CIARON MAHER & DAVID EUSTACE



Right up to the mark in the National Premiership, the Maher/Eustace yard keeps churning out the winners and also taking some majors along the way as it continues to build its Sydney stable. Their squadron of three-year-olds shape as perhaps the strongest in the country, headed by the brilliant Anders on a path to the TAB Everest.

PETER & PAUL SNOWDEN



The Snowdens have a long history of winning features - many of them with high quality younger horses. From his days with Crown Lodge to taking over the Darley empire, Peter Snowden has always had great respect. Together now with son Paul they have a stable full of quality, headed by a multiple Group 1 winner in three-year-old King's Legacy.

CHRIS WALLER



Sydney's ten-times Premier Trainer continues to dominate the racing landscape, having trained 111 G1 winners to the end of the last season. He will always be known as trainer of the mighty Winx. On TAB Epsom day last year he trained all three Group Ones at Royal Randwick. To top it off he took home the two biggest events in The TAB Everest and Iron Jack Golden Eagle.

GAI WATERHOUSE & ADRIAN BOTT



The Gai Waterhouse and Adrian Bott Tulloch Lodge yard had a superb Autumn carnival in 2020, winning Group 1 races week in and week out. 

HOW TO GET TO THE TRACK

ROSEHILL GARDENS

Rosehill Gardens is situated approximately 20km to the west of the Sydney CBD in what is the geographical heart of the city.

Three of the city's major vehicular arteries – Parramatta Road, Victoria Road and the M4 Motorway service Rosehill Gardens.

Schedules bus services run to Rosehill Gardens from Paramatta Station and Sydney Olympic Park, with increased services for raceday patrons.

PUBLIC TRANSPORT

Train Services

Trains run regularly to Parramatta where you can connect with buses to Rosehill Gardens.

Buses to/from Carlingford and Paramatta Station

Train replacement bus services (535 route) will operate daily with frequent stops from Valentine Avenue, Parramatta to Lloyds Avenue, Carlingford via Hassall Street, Rosehill.

The M92 service also operates to and from Paramatta Station.

There will be no disruption to accessing the P1, P3, P4 and P5 car parks, and the Rosehill footbridge will remain open for entry to the property.

TAXI/RIDE SHARE

Set Down - Taxis enter Rosehill Gardens Racecourse through the Grand Avenue gates. The set-down point is at the taxi rank. Taxis are not permitted to stop on James Ruse Drive and Grand Ave.

Pick Up - Taxis are located at the Grand Avenue end of the racecourse adjacent to the Might and Power entry.

HIRE CARS & LIMOUSINES

Limousines enter Rosehill Gardens Racecourse via the Gate 1 P1 Members Entry. Set-down and pick-up is available. Please follow directions from gate staff. Onsite parking is not available.

CAR PARKING

There is limited FREE car parking in P4 / P5 car park located on James Ruse Drive & Prospect Street and P6 Infield car park. Entry to the Infield car park is via Gate 2 Unwin Street.

ROYAL RANDWICK

Royal Randwick is located on Alison Road in Sydney's Eastern Suburbs and is approximately 6km from Sydney CBD and 8km from Sydney Airport. PUBLIC TRANSPORT

Royal Randwick is well serviced by public transport with Light Rail services running from Circular Quay and Central to Royal Randwick station,

and a purpose built bus terminal and slipway located immediately outside the main racecourse entrance on Alison Road.

PUBLIC TRANSPORT

Light Rail

The new L2 or L3 Randwick Line services run between Circular Quay and Randwick via Central Station (Chalmers Street).

Catch a light rail service to the Royal Randwick stop on Alison Road which is opposite the racecourse or the L3 which arrives at Ascot Street Gate. Services run regularly from 5.00am until 1.00am on weekdays and weekends. During major events, frequent express shuttle services will also run.

Buses

Plenty of regular route buses also run between the City and Eastern Suburbs via Anzac Parade and Alison Road to get you to Randwick Racecourse including Routes M50, 339, 373, 374, 376 and 377.

TAXI/RIDE SHARE & HIRE CAR

Taxis enter Royal Randwick through the Ascot St gates. The set-down and collection point is at the secure taxi rank.

Hire Car Collection is permitted via Gate 1 on Alison Road AFTER 3.00pm.

Hire cars are advised that there is a STRICT 15 minute collection/waiting time. Please have your pre-booked passengers waiting at the Hire Car collection bay (GATE D) prior to entering the precinct.

Taxis, ride share and hire cars are not permitted to stop on Alison Rd or Doncaster Avenue.

CAR PARKING

There is limited FREE car parking in the infield car park. Entry to the infield car park is via High Street, opposite UNSW.

The Ascot Street Multi Deck carpark is available for the use of ATC members ONLY. Pre-booking is required for all days, please contact ATC Membership for information.
